

Who are we?

The SRHCC, a 501c 3 non-profit organization, was established in 1994 to preserve and promote the Saugatucket River. In April 1999 we were designated the official watershed council for the Saugatucket by the State of Rhode Island's Rivers Council.

What have we accomplished?

- Partnered with the Town of South Kingstown on the riverway improvements and an outdoor classroom.
- Developed/conducted environmental education programs focusing on water quality to local schools.
- Worked with the RI Rivers Council to offer a Watershed Stewardship Class in South Kingstown.
- Provided trips along the river for the public.
- Hosted community lectures about our River.
- Served as an advocate for the river, the people and communities in the watershed.
- Was a catalyst for cleaning up the Rose Hill Landfill Superfund site

Where do we get our funding?

The RI Foundation has provided funding to develop programs that increase the awareness of the river. We have also received grants from: RI Rivers Council, the Partnership for Narragansett Bay and the South County Women's Club.

Our most valuable funders are the individual members within the Saugatucket watershed.

3. **Tri-Pond Park:** walking trails, nature center and canoeing or kayaking
4. **Wakefield Center:** fish ladder, river walkway and public access canoe dock and SRHCC office;
5. **Marina Park on Pt. Judith Pond:** the Saugatucket River's route to the sea, public boat ramp
